The violence seen was a hideous tragedy for the courgaeous woman, intent on raising awareness of the suffrage of women across the country. Witnesses to the accident explained that the event was a shocking moment of panic and surprise with very few witnessing the terrible moment.

It has been said that such millitant acts cause great harm to the campaign for women's votes, because no deserving cause is successful when resorting to violent means.

TITANIC SINKS FOUR HOURS AFTER HITTING ICEBERG

MOST APPALLING DISASTER EVER TO BE RECORDED IN THE HISTORY OF NAVIGATION

Ocean liner on its maiden trip from Liverpool to New York goes down after colliding with monstrous iceberg.

Yesterday, the largest floating ship known to man encountered difficulties whilst travelling off the coast of Newfoundland. The ship was just 375 miles into its journey to New York.

Despite the watertight cabins and doors, it seems that very few passengers have been able to escape safely in the icy cold temperatures. The full details of this horrific tragedy are yet to be revealed as the world patiently awaits the return of the few lucky survivors.
